Tips for Families to Create Successful Readers

Make Reading A Daily Routine

Research shows that reading to children every day is key to raising successful readers. Set a time every day; even ten to fifteen minutes is a great place to start, add time as you can. .





Choose a Quiet Time and Place

Set aside a quiet time with little to no distractions. Find a comfortable to place to sit together. Make reading a special activity for you and your child.

Help Your Child Select Books

Look for titles that are appropriate based on their interests and reading ability. Want some help in learning how to do this? Check out the Recommended books in the myON library.

Make Reading Interactive

Read using voices that are interesting and playful. Talk with your child and encourage them to make connections to their own experiences or real world. Allow time for you and your child to ask questions, make observations, and enjoy the text.

Expand Language and Vocabulary

Encourage your child to point to pictures that match the words being read, as well as read aloud familiar words. Explain new words and direct your child's attention to certain pictures, to provide details and meaning.

Build Reading Stamina

Reread familiar books with your child. Rereading provides a sense of satisfaction and success. Once your child is reading at a particular reading level, they need to read many books at that level, allowing them to practice and develop the ability to continue reading for longer periods of time.

Andros, Camille. Charlotte the Scientist Is Squished. Charlotte, a serious scientist and bunny, uses the scientific method to solve her problem: being squished by her many brothers and sisters.

Barroux. Where's the Elephant? A simple game of hide-and-seek quickly takes a new twist as a growing city encroaches on the jungle the animals call home. Where will the elephant, parrot, and snake go?

Bright, Rachel. Love Monster. Googlyeyed Monster looks high and low (and middle-ish) for someone to love him.

Campoy, Isabel. Maybe Something Beautiful. Mira lives in a gray and hopeless urban community until a muralist arrives and, along with his paints and brushes, brings color, joy, and togetherness to Mira and her neighbors.

Clanton, Ben. Rot: The Cutest in the World. Rot, a mutant potato, enters a "Cutest in the World" contest but worries when he sees his competition.

Dieckmann, Sandra. Leaf. When a polar bear arrives unexpectedly in the woods, the animals fear and avoid him until, one day, they watch as he attempts to fly over the water with wings made of leaves. Maybe he just needs some help to get home?

Dominguez, Andrea. *Knit Together*. A little girl who loves to draw but cannot knit, and her mother who loves to

knit but cannot draw, collaborate on a special project neither could have done alone.

Freedman, Deborah. By Mouse and Frog. Mouse has one idea about what a book should be and how to tell a story. Frog has another. What happens when they try to create a book together?

Gerstein, Mordecai. Night World. Sylvie the cat persuades her boy to go into the darkness very late at night, where they are greeted by shadows and nocturnal animals who whisper, "It's almost here."

Graegin, Stephanie. Little Fox in the Forest. A wordless picture book in which two friends follow a young fox deep into the woods and discover a wondrous and magical world.

Henkes, Kevin. Waiting. Five friends sit happily on a windowsill, waiting for something amazing to happen.

Keane, Claire. Once Upon a Cloud. Celeste wants to give her mother something special, but what? Her search takes her up to the sky, moon, and stars until she finds the perfect gift.

Lazar, Tara. Little Red Gliding Hood.

Luyken, Corinna. The Book of Mistakes. As an artist creatively incorporates her slip-ups into drawings, readers see how "mistakes" can provide inspiration and opportunity, and how both the art and artist are works in progress.

McAnulty, Stacy. Excellent Ed. Everyone in the Ellis family is excellent, except Ed the dog, who is determined to find something at which he, too, can excel.

Medina, Meg. Mango, Abuela, and Me. Mia's abuela has left her sunny house to live with Mia and her parents in the city. Mia helps Abuela learn English and learns some Spanish too, but it's still hard for Abuela to tell all her stories until Mia has the perfecto idea.

Menchin, Scott. Grandma in Blue With Red Hat. After his teacher explains why something might belong in a museum and says that anything can be in an art exhibition, a child offers his grandmother as an exhibit—until he has a better idea.

Nelson, Kadir. If You Plant a Seed. While planting seeds in their garden, two animals learn the value of kindness.
